RBI LAUNCHED CENTRAL BANK DIGITAL CURRENCY (CBDC) OR E₹ (DIGITAL RUPEE)

Reserve Bank defines CBDC as the legal tender issued by a central bank in a digital form. It is the same as a sovereign currency and is Central Bank Digital Currency – Is This the Future of Money, exchangeable one-to-one at par (1:1) with the fiat currency.

While money in digital form is predominant in India—for example in bank accounts recorded as book entries on commercial bank ledgers—a CBDC would differ from existing digital money available to the public because a CBDC would be a liability of the Reserve Bank, and not of a commercial bank.

RBI has launched pilots of CBDC in both Wholesale and Retail segments.

- The pilot in wholesale segment, known as the Digital Rupee -Wholesale (e₹-W), was launched on November 1, 2022, with use case being limited to the settlement of secondary market transactions in government securities. Use of (e₹-W), is expected to make the inter-bank market more efficient. Settlement in central bank money would reduce transaction costs by pre-empting the need for settlement guarantee infrastructure or for collateral to mitigate settlement risk.
- The pilot in retail segment, known as digital Rupee-Retail (e₹-R), was launched on December 01, 2022, within a closed user group (CUG) comprising participating customers and merchants.

What is Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC)?

- ◆ CBDCs are a digital form of a paper currency and unlike cryptocurrencies that operate in a regulatory vacuum, these are legal tenders issued and backed by a central bank.
- It is the same as a fiat currency and is exchangeable oneto-one with the fiat currency.
- The digital fiat currency or CBDC can be transacted using wallets backed by blockchain.
- ◆ Though the concept of CBDCs was directly inspired by Bitcoin, it is different from decentralised virtual currencies and crypto assets, which are not issued by the state and lack the 'legal tender' status.

Why CBDC being Introduced?

- ◆ To mitigate the risks and trim costs in handling physical currency, costs of phasing out soiled notes, transportation, insurance, and logistics.
- It will also wean people away from crypto currencies as a means for money transfer.

What are the Benefits of CBDC?

 The convenience and security of digital forms like cryptocurrencies.

- The regulated, reserved-backed money circulation of the traditional banking system.
- ◆ Easier Cross-Border Payments
- → Financial Inclusion

Challenges for CBDC

- Privacy Concerns like privacy of users—given that the central bank could potentially end up handling an enormous amount of data regarding user transactions.
- → Disintermediation of Banks the shift to CBDC can impinge upon the bank's ability to plough back funds into credit intermediation.
- ◆ Faster obsolescence of technology could pose a threat to the CBDC ecosystem calling for higher costs of upgradation.
- Elevated cyber security risks, vulnerability testing and the costs of protecting the firewalls.

INDIA WEIGHS SHIFT TO 'LIVING WAGES'

India is considering shifting from the minimum wage to living wages to pull millions of people out of poverty. While it can have huge financial implications for India Inc and the government as a living wage is indexed to inflation, the move could be a game changer for the country as it strives to meet its Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) commitment of eliminating extreme poverty by 2030.

"A living wage is defined as the minimum income necessary for workers to meet their basic needs compared to subsistence wage or a minimum wage which is based on labour productivity and skill sets".

The minimum wage is an amount set by law, whereas the living wage is determined by average costs to live, and the difference between the two could range from 10-25% depending on the cost of living in a place.

Senior labour ministry officials have been asked to weigh the pros and cons of living wages, including financial as well as economic and social implications on the country.

NEWS BITES

- SBI has raised Rs.10,000 crore of maiden infrastructure bond at a coupon rate of 7.51 per cent.
 It is the largest single infrastructure bond issued by any bank in the country.
- SBI adjudged as one of the Best Performing banks in SHG bank linkage by Ministry of Rural Development, GOI.
- ♦ 6.41 Crore Green Pins generated without branch visit and 27.81 Crore GCC transactions without using paper in SBI.
- SBI's Renewable energy capacity for captive use comprising Solar & Wind Power stands at 35 MWp.
- Bank has adopted 100 Primary Schools across the country. Setting up of New digital classrooms, Science lab, and renovation works for school building are undertaken.
- KYC for Mutual funds: Investors can now complete their KYC digitally without having to visit any mutual fund office, registrar or distributor's office using Aadhaar based e-KYC.
- UPI transactions across rural and semi-urban retail counters rose 650 per cent year -on-year for the 10-month period ended October 31. In terms of volumes, UPI transactions were higher by 500 per cent.
- Retail demand for gold as an investment has gone down by 15% in 10 days amid a sudden jump in the price of the yellow metal.
- Demonetisation was an integral part of nation-building, RBI tells Supreme court
- The government said Decision on privatization of PSBs after consultation with the department and the regulator concerned.
- 50 major willful defaulters have defrauded the banking system of Rs. 92,000 crore, the Finance ministry told the Lok Sabha. The list is led by Gitanjali Gems, accounting for a fraud of over Rs. 7,800 crore.
- ♦ Bank's gross NPAs to fall to 3.9-4.3% by FY24, said ICRA.
- SBI's portfolio of personal loans crossed the Rs. 5 trillion mark at the end of the November 30 this year due to tactical measures and digital initiatives.
- Reserve Bank's first pilot project for retail digital rupee is a "game changer" with durable effects that should better monetary transmission at much lesser costs, SBI chairman Dinesh Khara.
- Global recession risks rise as central banks raise rates. After increasing rates by half percentage point each, the heads of the US federal Reserve, the ECB and the Bank of England all said more increases are likely next year.
